Financial/Donations:

• The Friends of the Library donated funds to pay for a total of 10 juvenile and young adult Playaways, as well as our charging stations and surge protector power strips in the Reading Room. The Friends also voted to cover the costs of the three new public computers we ordered through SALS as replacements for aging computers.

News/Issues:

- We have completed the project of moving books around within the library: our biography collection and oversized books are now housed in the Reading Room, and we have shuffled books within the regular shelves of the library to take advantage of the additional space. Many thanks to the volunteers and staff who did lots of extra work to make this possible!
- We've begun working on reorganizing the office space to clean out unused items and materials, tidy all of the library's historical materials in the cabinets, and make room for our own roll-top desk and office supplies. Peg Culver has been the key player in this project thus far.
- Once the office space project is complete, then we can hopefully begin work on expanding the children's area.
- Peg Underwood has been active in dealing with the old/rare books and has sent two to the auction house at this point. We will know the results of this in October.

Programs:

- Noah Spivak has been at the library every Tuesday evening from 5:00 7:00 for the past month, offering his services and expertise to help our patrons with general computer questions and help with computer repair issues. There have been several people coming in to take advantage of this. Mr. Spivak has also been bringing in VR (virtual reality) goggles, and there have been some kids coming in to try these out.
