- After-School Coordinator candidate was interviewed by Melissa and Karen on March 28. The
 person has a background working with students (specifically fourth and fifth graders), an upbeat
 attitude, good references, and Melissa has offered her the position pending board approval. If
 accepted by Board, staff would like her to start Wednesday, April 9, 2025.
- Variety of activities through April including a town-wide trash pick up, which is co-sponsored through the Town, Courthouse, and SAW (more below).
- **Bird Watcher's Club is Taking Off!** John Loz of Southern Adirondack Audubon Society has taken a shine to Bancroft and is excited by the Bird Watcher's Club. He is working to bring a lot of programs to our library, which is wonderful.
- Battenkill Inspired learning station was provided to the library by Todd DeGarmo of the Folklife Center/Courthouse Board. It is now currently standing in the Proudfit hallway, and it is a resource for those who want to learn about the Battenkill and people and communities along the river.
- Monthly Groups on the Rise! Bancroft has seen five new regular programs come to the library this year: Herbal Study Group regrouped/restarted this year, Growth Collective Book Club, What's Up With That? Book Club, Yoga at the Library (new monthly program offered by Venus Jancek), and a Homesteading Group (may start meeting soon!)
- Music by Caffe Lena (Program with Courthouse and School) Thanks to Herb Perkins and Gail Bearup for getting a grant to bring music to Salem seniors and students. The library hosted the first of these this spring while the Courthouse is being renovated. Next program is with 2nd graders at Courthouse on April 24th at 1:30 pm.
- Review of Strategic Plan Melissa is working on a review of which strategic plan goals we have been able to move forward with this year. She'll send it out when finished.
- Book Donation Bin Being Used The book bin has been filled seven times and emptied. We
 are currently on our eighth bin, which is fantastic.
- **Weeding of Collection –** We are still weeding the collection.
