

## January Board Meeting – Bancroft Public Library

### Director's Report

#### News/Updates & Issues

- **New Kids' Chairs Purchased:** we purchased four new wipeable bean bag chairs for the kids' area. This money will be pulled from the Donations account.
- **Shared Office Space -**
  - **Rolltop Desk** – was sold in December.
  - **New Shelving:** Mark, Karen, and Melissa would like to put shelving along the wall to hold the purple bags. Mark is working on a plan.
- **Applied for WMHT Early Literacy Kits** – Melissa applied for the early literacy kits from WMHT. We did not receive them this time, but we were asked to apply again in February.
- Melissa applied for Bancroft Library to be a part of "We Are Instrumental"--this is a new collaboration within SALS. We can take donations of music instruments (not pianos nor drums), and send them through delivery to SALS where Cole's Woodwind Music Shop will rehab/repair the item. The item then gets sent to teachers in the school systems that might need a particular instrument (see more below) - January Update – We are still waiting to hear back on this, but should be rolling by February.
- **Applying for Stewart's Grant** – Melissa applied in December. We hope to hear back in February/March.
- **Vacuum** – Has been working well! Whew.
- **Challenges with Book Orders** – We are still struggling to purchase books from Ingram. Karen has started using Amazon for book purchases, which has been working fine.
- **Book Donation Bin Being Used** – The book bin has been filled approximately 22 times and emptied. We are currently on our 23<sup>rd</sup> bin, which is fantastic.

#### Follow Up from Previous Meetings

- **Carpet Cleaning** – Melissa will schedule carpet cleaning for end of March, early April.
- **Mold in Basement** – we still need to follow up on this from the last meeting. Melissa did buy one option for cleaning the wall.
- **Banner** – Melissa started work on this in October, but hasn't had time to move forward with creating a design for banner for tabling events.

### Outreach in the Local Community (and Beyond!)

- We Are Instrumental Program (in collaboration with SALS and area schools and students).
  - **So how does this magic happen?**
  - When your library becomes a partner, it becomes a donation drop-off site. Community members can bring instruments to the library and fill out a simple form. You then send the instrument through delivery to SALS. Cole's Woodwind Shop in Saratoga evaluates and repairs it. Once it is ready, WAI picks it up and delivers it to a school in need.
  - Occasionally, an instrument may arrive at your library labeled for a specific music teacher. In that case, you simply hold onto it until the teacher picks it up and places that instrument directly into the hands of an eager student.
